## 1. Why go abroad?

- Personal development (independence, flexibility, adaptability)
- Social skills (friendships, intercultural skills)

- Improve language skills
- Expand your academic network
- Enhance your future employability

## 2. Two types of exchange

#### • Faculty exchange

- Managed by **faculty's** international office
- Open to students from faculty/study programme only
- Usually for your specific field of study
- Within Europe (Erasmus+)
- Sometimes outside of Europe
- Various application deadlines

#### Contact

<u>International coordinator</u> of your own faculty or programme.


#### • University-wide exchange

- Managed by central International Relations Office (IR) of Student and Educational Affairs (SEA)
- Generally open to all students
- Possible to study outside your field of study at different faculties
- Only outside of Europe
- ISEP programme
- Application deadline is 1 December for Fall and Spring

- University-wide and faculty-wide agreements
- No additional tuition fees
- Compatible universities
- Credit transfer
- Many options Worldwide! BA & MA
- Assistance from International Relations Office and faculty international offices


### Study abroad on an exchange agreement



#### Things to keep in mind:

- Flexibility in course choice
- Exchange is not guaranteed, so you need a plan B
- Financial consequences
- Possible study delay

#### **Steps to take: Are you eligible for exchange?**




## 3. Requirements



- Motivation letter --> template <u>online</u>





## 7. ISEP as an exchange option

- <u>US-based organisation with member universities</u>
- Part of the university-wide programme
- As one of your 10 choices for uni-wide application
- Internal selection → International Relations Office places and nominates you to ISEP
- Placement by ISEP at one of your choices

**Deadline:** 1 December 23:59 hrs

## **ISEP** Application procedure

- After placement by IR you will apply directly to ISEP
- Select up to 10 universities (programmes/sites)
- The ISEP head office decides which member university you may attend
  - You will always be placed somewhere
  - You pay the fixed costs in advance
  - You may need to do an English language test (TOEFL or IELTS)
     scores vary per member institution

## **Payments and legal structure**

- Registration fee to ISEP: US \$ 100 nonrefundable fee (during online application)
- Placement fee to ISEP: US \$425
  - You need a credit card or you can pay by wire transfer
- Housing and meals to LU: €4300 per semester (in June)
- Compulsory ISEP Student Health Insurance: US \$ 108 per month (subject to change)

## 8. Making your choice

Questions to ask yourself:

- What are your reasons to study abroad?
- What type of atmosphere and environment do you prefer?
- Do you have special requirements due to disability or illness?



### Which destinations are safe?

#### Check the Ministry of Foreign Affairs travel advice

- Leiden University does not allow travels to orange and red countries!
- Travel to green and yellow countries only (Ministry of Foreign Affairs)
- Download the app



#### **Country specific health and safety considerations**

- Strict laws (rules on drugs and alcohol)
- Cultural differences
- Climate
- Risk of Tsunami/earthquakes
- Political climate (social unrest)
- Equal treatment of gender identities and sexual orientations (ILGA.org)
