Prof. C.L. Hofman	Archaeology of the Americas, with emphasis on the deep history of the Caribbean and adjacent areas, settlement archaeology, material culture studies, and community engagement
Prof. J.C.A. Kolen	Landscape Archaeology and Cultural Heritage from a Heritage Management perspective
Prof. M.A. Soressi	(RMA/ RMSc, depending on topic) Hominin Diversity Archaeology, with emphasis on the Middle Palaeolithic, the Early Upper Palaeolithic, and application of archaeological sciences to Palaeolithic archaeology.
Prof. M.J. Versluys	Classical and Mediterranean Archaeology, with emphasis on the cultural dynamics of the Hellenistic-Roman world
Prof. J.A.C. Vroom	Medieval and Early Modern Eurasia, specializing in the material culture of the 7 <sup>th</sup> to 19 <sup>th</sup> centuries
Dr. Q. Bourgeois	Burial Mounds and Funerary archaeology combined with network analysis and GIS approaches in later prehistory of Europe
Dr. D.J.G. Braekmans	(RMSc) Understanding of the nature and use of natural resources, and material objects.
Dr. M. De Campos Francozo	Museology, with emphasis on museum collections, history of collections and provenance studies, specially but not exclusively focused on Latin America.
Dr. ir. M. Driessen	(Military) logistics, infrastructure and trade in the Roman period
Prof. Dr. B.S. Düring	Near Eastern Archaeology, with emphasis on the emergence of social complexity and the archaeology of imperialism
Dr. M.H. Field	(RMSc) Archaeobotany, with emphasis on the Mid- to Late Pleistocene in Europe and putting archaeology into a stratigraphical and palaeoenvironmental context.
Dr. A. Geurds	Archaeology of the Isthmo-Colombian Area & Mesoamerica, focusing on landscape, identity and monumentality. History and theory of archaeology, aspects of Contemporary Archaeology, as well as collaborative archaeology in the Americas.
Dr. A.G. Henry	(RMSc) Plant microremains in archaeological context and plant food consumption by Neanderthals and Early modern Humans
Dr. T. Kalayci	(RMSc) Sensor data integration, urban studies, environmental modelling, production landscapes, and landscapes of movement within Near Eastern and Mediterranean contexts
