A.

1. Inform your contact person at Leiden University (e.g. your Coordinator of Studies) as soon as possible if your study abroad programme has to be cancelled or has been interrupted;
2. Inform the Humanities International Office (studyabroad@hum.leidenuniv.nl) as soon as possible if your study abroad programme has to be cancelled or has been interrupted;
3. If your study abroad programme has to be cancelled or has been interrupted, the Humanities International Office will decide how much of your scholarship will be claimed back;
4. In case of examination fraud, or other forms of misconduct, the Humanities International Office will decide how much of your scholarship will be claimed back.
