

Terms and Conditions Sustainable Humanities Scholarship

A. Part I

1. You must be enrolled in one of the following study programmes at the Faculty of Humanities:
 - BA African Languages and Cultures
 - BA Middle Eastern Studies
 - BA Korean Studies
 - BA Chinese Studies
 - BA Japan Studies
 - BA South and Southeast Asian Studies
 - BA Latin American Studies
 - BA Russian Studies
 - MA Asian Studies 120 EC / Chinese Studies
 - MA Asian Studies 120 EC / Japanese studies
 - MA Asian studies 120 EC / Korean Studies
2. You are nominated by your study abroad programme to participate;
3. You are not applying for any other Leiden University grant (e.g. LUSTRA+);
4. The Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs does not advise against all but essential travel, nor does it advise against all travel to the concerning country / area;
5. You have registered your study abroad period in the mobility management database of Usis;
6. You have read and understood the Regulations on studying abroad as published on the university website:

B. Part 2

1. The scholarship application will be processed once it is established that you are eligible to take part of the study abroad programme.
2. In case your study abroad programme has to be cancelled or has been interrupted, inform the following persons as soon as possible in writing: your coordinator of studies, the study abroad coordinator of your programme (if applicable) and the Humanities scholarship coordinator. If you fail to do so, the Humanities scholarship coordinator may decide to claim back your scholarship.
3. The Humanities scholarship coordinator reserves the right to proclaim (a proportionate part of) the scholarship amount in the case of cancellation, premature ending or interruption of your study abroad programme, in case it becomes clear that the receiver of the scholarship did not comply to the terms and conditions or in case it becomes clear that the scholarship is not used for the intended purpose.
4. If you fail to pass the examinations at the host institution, the Humanities scholarship coordinator reserves the right to proclaim (a proportionate part of) the scholarship amount.
5. In case of examination fraud or other forms of misconduct, the Humanities scholarship coordinator reserves the right to proclaim the scholarship amount.

C. Part 3

Your scholarship is a single award intended for the sole purpose of funding your study abroad as part of your Leiden University study programme. Examples of eligible costs are: travel costs to and from the host institution (one time), vaccinations, insurance, visa.
