

Terms & Conditions Uhlenbeck Scholarship Mandatory Study Abroad

A. Part I

1. You are majoring in one of the following (research) master degree programmes at the Faculty of Humanities: African Studies, Classics and Ancient Civilisations, and Latin American Studies. Additionally, studying abroad is a mandatory part of your study programme.
2. You will carry out one of the following activities:
 - Do research/field work leading up to credits
 - Studying at a host university leading up to credits
 - Combine research/field work with studying at a host university leading up to credits
3. You have been selected and have met the requirements to go abroad.
4. You have not received a study/fieldwork grant from the Uhlenbeck scholarship programme during your current degree programme.
5. You have read the health and safety guidelines carefully before going abroad (LINK <https://www.student.universiteitleiden.nl/en/study--studying/studying-abroad/health-and-safety/health-and-safety/humanities/art-history-ma?cf=humanities&cd=art-history-ma>)
6. The country or region of your internship is safe and has not been assigned one of the following classifications by the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs: 'We advise essential travel only' or 'We advise against all travel'. 7. You have registered your study abroad period in the mobility management database of Usis;
8. You have read and understood the *Regulations on studying abroad* as published on the university website: <https://www.organisatiegids.universiteitleiden.nl/en/regulations/general/regulations-on-studying-abroad>
9. You have submitted your application in time.

B. Part II

1. The scholarship will be paid once it is established that you have met all requirements.
2. Inform the Humanities International Office (studyabroad@hum.leidenuniv.nl) as soon as possible when your study abroad period has to be cancelled or has been interrupted.
3. If your study abroad period has to be cancelled or has been interrupted, the Humanities International Office may decide how much of your scholarship will be claimed back.
4. In case of examination fraud or other forms of misconduct, the Humanities International Office may decide how much of your scholarship will be claimed back.
5. In case you do not return in time to continue your study at Leiden University, the Humanities International Office may decide how much of your scholarship will be claimed back.
6. In case you do not receive more than 10 EC for your study abroad period, the Faculty of Humanities may decide how much of your scholarship will be claimed back.

Your scholarship is a single award intended for the sole purpose of funding your study abroad period.
