

Yet at this very moment of growing urgency for global governance, multilateral institutions struggle to maintain, let alone increase, their power, effectiveness, and legitimacy.

How can multilateralism (that is, formally institutionalized intergovernmental collaboration) be reinvigorated to meet the acute global challenges of our day? This spring sees the release of two major reports with key workable recommendations to this end. The United Nations Secretary-General's High-Level Advisory Board on Effective Multilateralism assembles leading experienced policy practitioners from around the world. Its report has been released as A Breakthrough for People and Planet: Effective and Inclusive Global Governance for Today and the Future. In parallel, the SNS Democracy Council 2023 involves leading researchers comprehensive assessment of available knowledge on present and future multilateralism. Its report has been published as Global Governance: Fit for Purpose?

This event presents feasible reform proposals from these complementary reports to academic and policy communities in The Hague, the International City of Peace and Justice. High levels of interest and informed debate will spotlight and propel forward important recommendations for a revitalized multilateralism.






