Many contemporary injustices are structural in nature, argues Catherine Lu in her award-winning book **Justice and Reconciliation in World Politics**. These structural injustices include anti-Black and anti-Indigenous racism, as well as doctrines of white supremacy, that affect how people view themselves, others, and their relations in the social world. To combat such injustices, Professor Lu suggests there is a need for decolonisation, decentering and disalienation. What do these ideas imply, including for the teaching and learning at our universities?
