

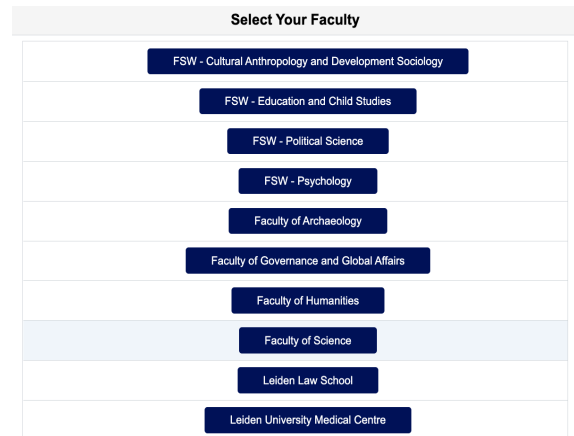
Visit the [Study Abroad World Map](#) on Leiden University's website.

Filter Results

When you open the webpage, you should be prompted to select your faculty via a pop-up window.

Step 1:

Select your Faculty: *Faculty of Science*. (If this pop-up does not appear on your screen, you can select your faculty through the filter menu on the World Map's landing page.) This is your first filter — it filters out all partner universities open to students of the Faculty of Science.



Step 2:

Choose the appropriate Level for your time abroad: *Bachelor* or *Master*. This filter will be among the additional filters on World Map's landing page.

Step 3:

Select the right Exchange Programme: *University-wide exchange* or *Faculty exchange*. This is an important filter, as Leiden has two different types of exchange programmes, and these involve different partner universities. An exchange is facilitated by a contract between Leiden University and the partner university. If this contract is open to all Leiden University students, it's called a university-wide exchange. If this contract is open to (some) students of the Faculty of Science, it's called a faculty exchange.

Different exchange programmes also mean:

- 1) different deadlines and procedures
- 2) a different contact person at Leiden University

More information on the different programmes can be found on the [Exchange page](#) on Leiden University's website. You are allowed to apply for both programmes, but not simultaneously. Applications for university-wide exchange have an earlier deadline than those for faculty-wide exchange.

Most exchange students go abroad on a faculty exchange programme. Please therefore set this filter to *Faculty exchange*. It is important to note that faculty-exchange partners enter exchange contracts with specific study programmes. This means that not all contracts will be relevant to all students. Unfortunately, it is not currently possible to filter by fields of study. Information on how you can view a partner's fields of study can be found below (under: Agreement Details).

Step 4 (optional):

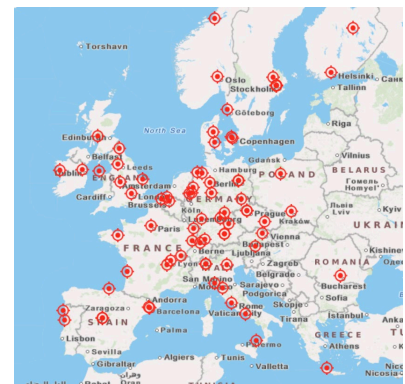
If you wish, choose from one of the remaining filters: **Language of Instruction**, a desired **Country** of destination, and/or a **Partner University** of your choice. However, be careful with setting too many filters, as this may unintentionally alter your results.

Should you wish to remove your filters and reset your search, you can do so by clicking the *Reset Filters* button under the filter menu. Please note that set filters are applied automatically.

Step 5:

Review your options. With every filter that is selected, your choices are narrowed down. Once all the relevant filters have been set, every partner university open to you will be marked by a **red target icon** on the World Map. More information about the partner university can be accessed by clicking on the red target icon. This opens a pop-up containing the *Agreement Details*.

Agreement Details

Step 6:

Check the partner university's Agreement Details. Under *Agreement Details* you can find a multitude of information. The most important section is *Fields of Study* — this indicates within which field of study you can follow courses at the partner university.

You are not limited to your own field of study, but if an agreement is listed under (the Department of) Astronomy, for example, the majority of your courses at that partner university must probably be within the field of Astronomy. Check the partner university's website, linked in the *Agreement Details*, and previous students' experiences in the [Student Report Database](#) to be sure.

i.e. if you are an Astronomy student, Aarhus University (Fields of Study: Faculty of Natural Sciences) will be less relevant to you than Stockholm University (Fields of Study: Department of Astronomy). Based on the Agreement Details, Stockholm University is a better fit.

Other relevant information included under *Agreement Details* can include the partner university's *Academic Calendar*, *Language(s) of Instruction*, potential *Language Requirements*, information on how the *Credits and Grading* relate to Dutch standards, information on *Housing*, possible scholarships under *Financial Remarks*, and a fact sheet provided by the partner under *Downloads*. The available information differs per university. Be sure to always check the partner university's website yourself for the most up-to-date information.

This may seem like a lot of information! An easy way to compare multiple *Agreement Details* is by clicking the [Add to Compare](#) button at the bottom of the *Agreement Details*. When you have selected multiple partner universities for comparison, a [View Compare](#) button will appear to the left of the *Reset Filters* button on the World Map's landing page. Clicking this button allows you to view multiple *Agreement Details* side-by-side for easier comparison.

Therefore, you are accepted by a department, and you must take the majority of your courses at this particular department, i.e. minimum 20 ECTS per semester at one primary degree programme offered by this department. You are allowed to select up to 10 ECTS per semester from one other degree programme offered by a department at either Faculty of Natural Sciences or Faculty of Technical Sciences.
