

## GUIDE PRESENTATIONS MASTER PROJECTS EDUCATION AND CHILD STUDIES

All Master's projects within the Master's program *Education and Child Studies* are concluded with a power point presentation during a symposium.

The symposia take place once a month. The dates are determined annually and can be found in the schedule on the [website](#). Students must register with a form that can be downloaded from this website. A program will be made for each symposium, which will be communicated to the participating students by email. A symposium is supervised by a chairperson (a lecturer). The symposia are attended by the students who provide the presentations. Each presenting student may bring a maximum of two guests.

The student may give a presentation when the Master's project is at an advanced stage. Data, results and conclusions should be available. The supervisor of the Master's project assesses whether the student can participate in a symposium. A statement of approval is included on the registration form, which must be signed by the supervisor. The signed form can be sent by email to [Gluykx@gsw.leidenuniv.nl](mailto:Gluykx@gsw.leidenuniv.nl).

The presentation is a compulsory part of all specializations of the Master's program *Education and Child Studies*. The result will be reported in *uSis*. In order to graduate, a student must have fulfilled this obligation.

### Information presentation meeting Master's project

#### *Description*

Students give a presentation about their Master's thesis research in a meeting with several presenting students, lecturers and other interested parties.

#### *Entry requirements*

The presentation of the thesis research is a compulsory part of the Master's project. The presentation may take place as soon as the conclusions of the research are available, even if the text of the Master's thesis is not yet completely ready.

#### *Learning goals*

- Preparing an oral scientific presentation, with a good substantive structure and citations.
- Training oral presentation and communication skills.
- Learn to answer critical questions in an adequate and professional manner.
- Practice asking critical and relevant questions in response to scientific presentations.

### *Schedule*

- Students register by submitting a form signed by the supervising teacher to the Institute Service for Pedagogical Sciences or by email to [Gluykx@fsw.leidenuniv.nl](mailto:Gluykx@fsw.leidenuniv.nl).
- A maximum of two interested guests can be invited per student to attend the presentation.
- It is mandatory for presenting students to attend the entire meeting.

### *Content of presentation*

The presentation covers at least the following aspects:

- Question
- Research method
- Results
- Discussion:
  - o Limitations of the study.
  - o Placing results in a broader scientific context.
  - o Implications for society, research field, healthcare, etc.

### *Assessment*

- The presentation is assessed with a pass or fail.
- The chairman gives the assessment using a standard assessment form. The completed and signed assessment form is handed in by the chair to the Student Servicecentre shortly after the presentations.
- The presentation is graded with a V (Pass) or an O (Unsatisfactory). The obtained result will be announced via *uSis*. Students can also collect a copy of the assessment form three days after the presentation from the Institute Service for Education and Child Studies.
