Disclaimer:

- It is not allowed to award yourself more points than the maximum number of points that is indicated in a certain category.
- Every activity can only be awarded once (so not repeated in multiple categories).
- In the column 'examples ', approved activities have been added for each component as an example. This is not a definitive answer, just an example. Other activities are still possible.
- All promotion-related activities for both internal and external events, groups and committees are to be counted together as one, for which only 5 points can be awarded in total; e.g. promotion for Career Services and Pop Corner cannot be counted as to separate activities.
- When a series of similar (low effort) events is hosted, e.g. a series of Study Sessions, they are to be counted as one series, and awarded the 10 points once; events in a series cannot be awarded points separately.
- No points are granted for attending University wide events where your attendance is already expected, e.g. Opening of the Academic Year, Dies Natalis, and the 'reverse' Constitutional Reception of the Executive Board
- Activities submitted in the 'Special Efforts' category must be exemplary, new, and a substantial effort; repeated events are not considered, all events must be completely new to the association

Please mind:

- State for each activity (lecture/symposium/trip/party, etc.) the name of the activity, the date and times, the number of participants of the activity and an explanation of the activity.
- The maximum number of points (excluding member administration) is 1700 points.
